Witch School contract broken, earnest money to be returned

A contract to purchase the former Grant Township building for a witch school has been broken, according to an area newspaper.

The News-Gazette reported on Thursday that the Rev. Ed Lewis, CEO of Telepathic Media, Inc., and his partner, the Rev. Don Lewis, were released from their contract to purchase the building, at 200 E. Penn after a purchase agreement expired.

Arlen Alwardt and real estate agent Larry Tobeck own the building.

but that pressure from residents and other activities made opening a school in Hoopeston a waste of Hubbard's time. He added that in letting the contract expire, he lost earnest money put on the building, money that some residents said would be repaid if the school did not open.

One of the ministers who agreed to repay the money said the \$1,000 Hubbard quoted as having put down will be repaid.

"There was a group of us that was willing to raise the \$1,000," said Pastor Steve Nelson of the First Baptist Church of Hoopeston. "If Tim (Kovalcik, pastor of the East Lynn United Methodist Church) said it and I agreed to it, we'll do it. We will be honest in our word and raise the \$1,000. If we made a promise, we're not going to go back on it."

Hubbard announced on July 1 that he would not open the school after he met with area residents who opposed the school. "I've never faced this level of religious opposition in my life," he said during the meeting. In a statement written later, Hubbard was quoted as fearing for the safety of WitchSchool staff and students if the school opened in Hoopeston.

However, Hubbard apparently did not file a


