### **Grant Township Community Fund sets \$40,000 goal**

The United Community Fund of Grant Township is asking residents to dig deep for a worthy cause.

At a kickoff luncheon drive Wednesday. chairman Linda Sheppard said the group hopes to raise \$40,000 to fund area programs.

Last year's effort to raise \$40,000 fell short but Sheppard said this year's fundraising effort is off to a great start. A street corner drive in August raised approximately \$2,700 pledges. "We've got

about \$9,000 and we haven't gotten really started yet,"
