Reenactment of first Farm Progress Show set Sept. 20, 21

Highlighting 50 years of Farm Progress and its Vermilion County origin, Half Century of Progress will be held Saturday, Sept. 20 and Sunday, Sept. 21 on the south side of 3200 across from the Farm Progress parking area.

The reenactment of the original 1953 show will begin at 8 a.m. Saturday with a classic tractor drive.
