City council approves acceptance of former bank building

Hoopeston's Willdon Building may have a new owner in the near future.

Following closed session discussion at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, aldermen voted 5-3 to approve accepting the building from current owner Capstone Bank, said Alderman Bill Goodwine.

Goodwine was among those who voted against accepting the building. Others were aldermen Rod Kaag and Ed Lotz.

Aldermen voting to accept the fit were John Haughee, Kevin Davis, Carl Ankenbrand, Nancy Stipp and Brandon Hamilton.

While the city is willing to accept the building, Goodwine said a contract has not yet been written. The docu-

City officials had talked about accepting the building, then turning it over to Tad Ballantyne of Hoopeston Foods, Inc. Ballantyne was previously reported as wanting to create apartments in at least the upper two floors of the five-story building.

In unrelated action Tuesday, the council:

- accepted a joint \$50,000 bid from Spear Corporation and Silver Brothers for a new sand filtration system and concrete work at the Hoopeston Swimming Pool.
- approved a work agreement with Verizon for work in the alley between the 600 block of Chestnut and West Orange.
- approved a \$6,050 bid from HOW Construction for an overhead door at the new water building.
- learned approximately 450 new radio read water meters will be delivered in about a week and will be installed in three to four weeks. The new meters will first be used to replace the oldest meters in the city, on the northeast side.
