Michael Brown will officially begin duties as CEO Monday, after receiving formal board approval.

Brown's road has included work as an Air Force policeman, nurse and professional firefighter/paramedic prior to entering healthcare administration. Most recently, he was executive vice president and chief operating officer at Pharmacy Systems, Inc., in Dublin, OH, where he served 70 hospitals in nine states.

With a background in community-based hospitals, Brown said coming to HCMH was not a job change. "I wasn't looking for a job," he said. "I was looking for an opportunity...for me to get back to what I do and what I know." Brown said he will continue to focus on how the facility can meet the needs of the community in providing not only services but in other ways, such as providing healthcare information. He would like to see the hospital overcome its "rural image" and expand its market to other areas and grow vertically by expanding its clinic services.

However, he stressed, the hospital's ability to thrive will not necessarily be based on becoming larger. "It's not about being big," he said. "It's about offering the community what it wants and needs." Those wants and needs will be coupled with "what we can afford to

be coupled with "what we can afford to pull off." he added.

Moving forward will be easier because the hospital has a good base, Brown said, praising staff and the board of directors. "They've paid attention to things and See CEO on other side

shored things up," he said. "They've positioned themselves to be able to (meet community needs.) The hospital is doing OK overall, not just compared to rural hospitals."

Brown is excited at the opportunity and the hospital board is equally excited to have him. "We're very happy to have him on board," said board president Russ Leigh. "He's a good addition to the hospital and the community. "We're real excited about his knowledge, experience and enthusiasm."

Leigh said the hospital received 25-30 applicants for the position, created when former CEO Frank Caruso resigned, effective April 23. Brown's application came "late in the process," but he was one of 13 applicants called for interviews. "He really blew us away right in the interview process," Leigh said. "He was worth the wait."

Brown, 46, and his wife, Sue Ellen, a pediatric nurse,
