Soggy festival will dampen Jaycees' Christmas projects

The effect of heavy rains during Labor Day weekend will reach into the end of the year without help from local residents.

The Hoopeston Jaycees are asking for help in meeting the needs of the less fortunate during the Christmas season.

The Jaycees fund the Senior Citizen Christmas Dinner, Toys for Kids and Underprivileged Children's Christmas Party with money raised during each National Sweetcorn Festival on Labor Day weekend. Rain on most days of the festival severely limited the money available for the projects, said Michelle Gonzalez, Jaycees board chairman.

The group is writing grants to get money for the Christmas projects but have no guarantee of funding. "If worse comes to worse, we'll have to cut at least one," Gonzalez said.

To cut expenses, the Jaycees have already changed the age range covered by Toys for Kids.

Previously, children between birth and 12 years were included. This year, the maximum age has been lowered to 10.

Help is needed in two ways. First, residents who have new or gently used toys are asked to donate them to Toys for Kids. Boxes will be placed in Hoopeston businesses by Nov. 1 to collect toys, said Gonzalez, who co-chairs the project with Dolores Crabtree.

The second need is money for the senior citizen dinner and kids' Christmas party, where children visit with Santa and are allowed to select gifts for family members.

Monetary contributions may be send to the Hoopeston Jaycees, P.O. Box 28, Hoopeston, IL 60942, ATTN: Christmas projects.

Gonzalez is hopeful the community will help the Jaycees meet the holiday need. "We'd like to thank the community for supporting our projects

Hoopeston Multi Agency seeks more participants for van trips

Funding agency requires more riders

Hoopeston senior citizens and those with disabilities are being encouraged to use the Hoopeston Multi Agency van for their transportation needs.

Major funding for the program comes from the Area Agency on Aging, which is requiring the Multi Agency to keep increasing ridership.

The van runs weekdays year-round. The schedule is:

Monday: Hoopeston/Rossville shuttle;

Tuesdays: special out-of-town trips to places such as Bloomington, Kankakee, Champaign and Terre Haute and Lafayette, Ind.

Wednesdays and Fridays: Danville; and

Thursdays: Hoopeston shuttle days.

The van is on the road from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day.

The Multi Agency is looking for those who have no means of transportation except for trips on which family members take them or those who no longer want to drive out of town for appointments or shopping trips.

Priority is given for doctor appointments, grocery shopping and pharmaceutical needs. However, the van also transports people to hair appointments, shopping malls, trips to businesses or social outings.


