





Hoopeston Area schools institute 'shelter in place' plan

While it may be unlikely that a terrorist group will attack Hoopeston, the Hoopeston Area school district has come up with a plan to keep students safe.

The plan was made public at Thursday's board meeting.

The "Shelter-In-Place" plan is a short-term measure to help secure the safety of each building's indoor atmosphere to temporarily separate students and staff from hazardous outdoor contamination or threats. The main objective is to move students to designated safe locations that will protect them until the disaster is deemed to be over.

The plan may be implemented if there are any unusual odors or smells; any skin or eye irritations; visible smoke, fire or vapor clouds outside the buildings; airway or breathing difficulties; or outside safety hazards reported by police.

In case of an incident, students will be kept in the building and those outside for recess will be called in. All windows and doors will be shut and heating and cooling ventilation systems will be shut down. The building principal will call 911 and contact the superintendent's office. The plan calls for absolute silence at all times. Students will be directed to stay

away from doors and windows and each designated shelter room will have a battery-operated radio and flashlight.

In case of an incident, parents are urged not to come to the school as doors will not be open during the shelter in place.


