Hoopeston soldier hopes writing campaign will lift morale

ZIMMERMAN

A Hoopeston man who will be serving in Iraq is asking area residents to pick up their pens.

Army Capt. Brock Zimmerman, with help from his mother, Linda, and her friend, Sharon Dixon, is working to organize a local letter-writing campaign to approximately 270 soldiers in his company.

Zimmerman knew before he entered the service how important letters are to service people. "I remember when my brother, Cortney, was in the Navy. He called home to ask Mom to write because one of his buddies never got any mail."

Since joining the Army, Zimmerman has seen firsthand how receiving letters gets soldiers through the day. "It's a big morale booster when they get mail," he said. "When I get a piece of mail, it really does feel good."

Zimmerman's plan is for area people to agree to write weekly and send monthly care packages to a specific soldier. Mrs. Zimmerman and Dixon will coordinate that effort, assigning members of the company to willing writers.

Suggested items for care packages include personal care items like razors, shaving cream soap, hand sanitizer, toilet paper, toothpaste, toothbrushes, dental floss, foot powder, sunscreen, lip balm, shampoo, deodorant and grooming kits.

Also, stationery, stamps, paperback books and magazines, Gatorade mix, nonperishable food, AAA, AA, D and C batteries, socks, black ink pens, insect repellant, envelopes, sewing kits and AT&T phone cards.

Soldiers may not receive alcohol or porno-

graphic materials, he added.

Zimmerman suggested that letterwriters exchange pictures with their soldier so each knows what the other looks like. He also suggested sending copies of local news publications so the soldiers will know a little about Hoopeston.

Zimmerman's company is expected to be in Iraq by mid-March at the latest. The group's main function will be to set up security at a base north of Bagh-

Zimmerman, who had been stationed in Germany, left Feb. 12 for Ku-

wait. He was expected to undergo training for approximately two weeks before being transferred to Iraq where he is expected to stay for 12 to 14 months. "It's going to be a long deployment," he said.

As a captain, Zimmerman is an executive officer and second in command and has the authority to pull such a project together. While he hopes people will write to his people, he asked that residents not neglect local boys serving, such as Andy Cade, Brandon Shuler and David Farrell.

Officials ready for 2004 Severe Storm Preparedness Week

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) is asking local emergency coordinators to prepare for spring storms and Earl Drollinger, Hoopeston Emergency Services and Disaster Coordinator, is complying.

IEMA is sponsoring Severe Weather Preparedness Week from Feb. 29-Mar. 6. The special week coincides with regular testing of emergency sirens held the first Monday of each month, said Drollinger, who is working with schools, media and others regarding weather preparedness.

Historically, March is a time of strong storms in Illinois. IEMA advises residents to know the warning system used for storms and to plan appropriate action in cases of severe weather.

Severe weather will prompt either watches or warnings. The differences are:

Severe Thunderstorm or Tornado Watch: Severe thunderstorms are possible. Watch the sky and listen to the radio or television for more information. Be prepared to take shelter.

Severe Thunderstorm or Tornado Warning: Severe thunderstorms are occurring. Take shelter. Turn

on a battery-operated radio or television to receive warnings and severe weather statements.

Before a severe storm or other disaster hits, residents are encouraged to develop plans to prepare for the disaster and what to do during and in the aftermath. At home, safety tips include:

• Go at once to your predetermined shelter (storm cellar, basement or the lowest level of the building). In a

basement, go under the stairs, under a heavy piece of furniture or a workbench. Stay there until the danger has passed.

- If there is no basement, go to an inner hallway or a small inner room without windows, such as a bathroom or closet.
- Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls.
- Go to the center of the room. Outside windows and walls may be penetrated by highspeed, wind-borne missiles.
- Get under a piece of sturdy furniture, such as a workbench or heavy table, and hold onto it.
- Use pillows, mattresses or cushions to protect your head and neck.
- If in a mobile home, get out and seek shelter elsewhere. A mobile home can overturn very easily even if precautions have been taken to tie down the unit. If there isn't a substantial shelter nearby, seek shelter in a low-lying area. Shield your head with your hands.

Tornado trivia

- Most tornado damage paths are less than 100 yards wide and a couple of miles long, but can be up to a mile wide and 50 miles long.
- Most tornadoes occur in the spring, but they have occurred every month of the year.
- In 2001, 21 tornadoes were reported in Illinois.
- In 2002, 35 tornadoes occurred in Illinois resulting in four deaths and 64 injuries.
- In 2003, a record setting 120 tornadoes occurred in Illinois, resulting in two deaths, 81 injuries, and more


