Council approves development estimates for TIF district

The firm working to develop the corner of Rtes. 1 and 9 could get as much as \$1,285,000 in reimbursed costs.

The Hoopeston City Council on Tuesday approved documents outlining reimbursable costs for Hoopeston IL Rx, LLC, a Chicago-area development company. Timothy Gallagher, of Gallagher Commercial, is listed as the head of the development company.

Estimated eligible project costs include land acquisition, \$360,000; site preparation, \$485,000; demolition, \$150,000; planning and engineering, \$50,000; legal, \$45,000; accounting, \$10,000; marketing, \$25,000; other professional fees, \$10,000; public infrastructure improvements \$75,000; utilities extension. \$50,000; and miscellaneous, \$25,000.

The council also approved a division of TIF funds at 70 percent to the developer and 30 percent to the city, based on a recommendation by consultant Dan Walker with Tom Jacobs & Associates of Bloomington.

As TIF funds accumulate, created by the difference in the base tax rate and subsequent increases caused by development or other factors, money will be put in a special TIF fund. The developer will receive 70 percent of eligible costs, up to the maximum \$1,285,000 and the city will receive 30 percent for its use.

In other business, the city may be willing to give the Willdon Building to a company that will bring jobs to Hoopeston.

The building is expected to be advertised in the Chicago Tribune, said Alderman Bill Goodwine, city finance committee chairman. Companies interested in the building must submit sealed bids with a business plan, number of jobs to be created and other information. If that does not work, Goodwine said, the city will seek bids to sell the building.

The council also:

- approved a one-year lease with the Vermilion County Health Department for space in the Willdon building for \$12,000. The previous lease had ben for \$10,208.
- learned the city is approved spending \$6,000 on new cabinets for the Market St. fire station from Country Cabinets of Hoopeston.
- approved spending a maximum \$4,300 for the annual audit, done by Russ Leigh & Associates.
- learned applications are being accepted for swim team coach, pool manager and lifeguards. Applications are available at city hall.




