Consultants recommend area school districts come together

ROSSVILLE—Three consultants who spent four months doing a feasibility study are recommending three school districts combine into one new one.

Consulting & Research Group recommends that Rossville-Alvin, Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning districts merge into a new district with high schools in Hoopeston and Bismarck and a vocational center at Rossville-Alvin High School.

Creating a new district would have several advantages, according to a report presented to representatives of Hoopeston Area, Rossville-Alvin, Bismarck-Henning, Armstrong-Ellis and Armstrong-Potomac schools last Thursday.

One boost would come in the form of state financial incentives. A combined district would receive more than \$4.6 million in incentives, according to the study.

If a combined high school were formed now, it would have slightly more than 900 students divided between the two locations. With more students, a new district could offer more courses, not only at the high school level, but also at the junior high/middle school level. The report recommends

more electives for students at the younger level, including foreign language classes.

Combining districts would mean paying less property tax for residents of some districts and more for others. Based on current data, the report projected a tax rate of \$3.39 in the education, operating/building maintenance and transportation funds, the largest three funds. That rate is 63 cents more than Hoopeston Area residents pay and less than the amount paid by residents of all the other districts.

Interviews were conducted with 51 residents, board members and administrators in the five districts. All districts by Armstrong-Ellis and Armstrong Potomac showed high interest in some kind of reorganization to offset declining enrollment and finances. Representatives from the Armstrong districts showed more interest in the possibility of merging with Champaign County schools which are closer, according to the report.

With the feasibility study released, boards of each district will now discuss what steps to take next. Early indications are favorable to the recommendation.

Hoopeston Area Superintendent Mark Conolly said he likes the recommendation. "I think it's very viable," he said, adding it will lead to further discussion among the districts.

Dennis Price, president of the Rossville-Alvin board president also praised the report and said it is time for school officials and residents to take a hard look at themselves and their districts and "stop putting our own wants and desires before what's best for the districts.

As for Rossville-Alvin High School becoming a vocational center for northern Vermilion County and perhaps other schools, "I think that's a
