

Mayor takes part in economic development conference

MACOMB —Rural communities throughout Illinois face major difficulties in stimulating local economies and are trying innovative local economic development approaches.

Chalmers Flint recently participated in the 15th annual Rural Community Economic Development conference hosted by the Illinois Institute for Rural Affairs at Western Illinois University, Rural Partners and the Governor's Rural Affairs Council. Lt. Governor Pat Ouinn was the keynote speaker at the conference, which highlighted strategies to attract and retain businesses, implement entrepreneurship policies and capitalize on local assets

Jay Kayne, Thomas C. Page Center for Entrepreneurship in Ohio, described award-winning programs currently used in several states. Some of these rural initiatives could be implemented in other areas with similar results.

Kathleen McMahon showed participants ways

to increase corporate information technology applications in development strategies to start businesses. Access to current technology is almost a requirement for modern businesses but many rural areas lag behind metro areas in Internet access.

In the past several years, manufacturing employment in rural Illinois has declined substantially. The conference concluded with organized discussions of ways to retain and attract manufacturing in rural Illinois. These discussions were held in conjunction with the Illinois Manufacturing Extension Center, which provides technical assistance to manufacturers across Illinois.

"Rural Illinois is facing difficult economic conditions," said Norman Walzer, director of the Illinois Institute for Rural Affairs at WIU. "Communities that prosper will be those with an entrepreneurial approach and which build on local assets in designing a development strategy."


