Hoopeston council drops plan to resurface Lincoln bricks

A plan to resurface East Lincoln Street hit the bricks at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting.

Karen Rudd, a Lincoln St., resident, presented a petition to the council with names of 51 people in the area who oppose resurfacing the brick street. "We feel our brick street is beautiful, it's historic and it's in good condition," Rudd said. "It doesn't need paved."

The plan was to overlay the street between Euclid and Market, straightening out bumps in the road but Georgia Hoskins, another Lincoln resident, said the bumps keep cars from going too fast. "I like the bumps," she said. "It slows them down just a tad."

The city will not be able to re-brick the street, said Alderman Rod Kaag, chairman of the city streets/ alleys committee. An estimate about the cost of repairing a 30'x500 brick street in Danville was \$305,538, he said. "There's no way we could pay that," he said.

Money to resurface the street was to come from savings to the city on the Market Street project but since residents object to resurfacing the street, that money will be used on another street, Kaag said.

In related discussion, Kaag announced that

work on Market Street will begin June 15. At the May 5 meeting, the council accepted a \$342,000 bid from Iroquois Paving Corp. of Watseka to resurface the street. The bid was \$100,000 less than the engineer's estimate.

In other action, the council:

- approved allowing the Hoopeston Fire Department to submit bids on used equipment from the Bourbonnais Fire Department. The department will use accrued money to try to purchase a fire truck and a tanker.
- learned five Hoopeston Police officers were given certificates from the Alliance Against Intoxicated Motorists. Officers Ephriam Bolin, Jeremy Welch, Adam Watson and Chad Smith and Sgt. Jimmy Goodrum were recognized by the group.
- approved paying \$3,762 to Asphalt Improvement Corp. of Mattoon to put a rubberized material in cracks on Main St. from the railroad tracks to Third St. and Penn St. between Market and Second Ave. If the process works well, the city will pay an additional \$3,660 to do from Market to the edge of town, Kaag said.
- approved a \$7,037 bid from Olympic Hard-
