Pop-ups, viruses can be more than annoying, can be stopped

Many solutions available are free By JAMES EYRICH

Pop-ups - those windows that open on top of a web page you really want to see - are annoying, to say the least and viruses are costing computer users big money when technicians must be hired to fix the damage caused by them.

Home computer users can help themselves and their computers by following a few simple tips, including:

- 1. Use a pop-up blocker. Pop-ups and ad serving malware programs are rapidly becoming the scourge of home computer users. Spam may waste your time by increasing the number of messages you have to retrieve when checking your mail and increasing the number of messages you must sort through when reading your messages, however they usually doesn't cause your computer to crash and require a visit from a computer technician. Google has a very good tool called the Google toolbar that includes a pop-up blocker that works very well. The best thing it is free. Go to toolbar.google.com and follow the installation instructions.
- 2. Get rid of existing pop-ups. You may already have spyware and malware programs on your computer. I suggest downloading and running Lavasoft's Adaware and Spybot Search and Destroy personal versions of both programs are free and available at download.com.
- 3. Keep your anti-virus program up-to-date. Viruses and virus variants are being released into the wild at an unprecedented rate. If your virus definitions are more then a couple days out-of-date your computer and any data you have stored on it are at risk of infection. Even worse is that some viruses and worms now capture your keystrokes. The captured keystrokes which might in-

Norton and McAfee are 2 popular commercial anti-virus solutions. AVG by Grisoft has a free edition downloadable from grisoft.com.

- 4. Use a cable/DSL router. If you connect to the Internet through a broadband provider (wireless, satellite, cable, DSL, etc) use a cable router to protect your computer from hackers on the Internet. These devices block any incoming packets from the Internet that are not in response to requests that originated from the user's computer. Many of the vulnerabilities found in the family of Windows operating systems can not be exploited when a user has a home router between their computer and the Internet. The small routers can be purchased for \$40 or less. Popular brands include Linksys, Dlink, and Netgear.
- 5. Use a firewall. If you use dial-in to access the Internet use a software firewall. Windows XP has one built in, make sure to turn it on. Enabling it is explained at about.com/cs/5/ht/winxpfirewall.htm.
- 6. Keep your computer operating system and software up-to-date. Use windowsupdate.microsoft.com to download and apply Windows and Internet Explorer security patches. You should check for these updates on a weekly basis. Make sure to install any item listed under the critical updates section.
- 7. Use proper surge protection on both power and any phone lines connected to your computer. APC and Tripp Lite are two popular power protection manufactures.
- 8. The last thing to remember is that if your computer starts acting funny and doing strange things, do not wait long before calling a technician. The longer you wait the worse it can get. The worse the problem, the longer it will take a technician to fix and the more money it will cost you.
