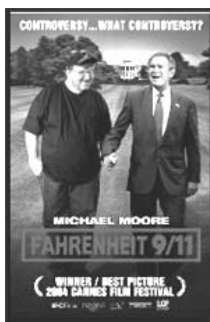

## Hoopeston Multi Agency receives \$15,000 grant allocation

The Hoopeston Multi Agency has received a \$15,000 grant from the Blowitz-Ridgeway Foundation of Chicago.

Money will be used in five areas, said Betty Shaffer, HMA executive director. Those areas are:

1.) The agency's school supply program. The Multi Agency provides free school supplies to low-income children.

2.) Two summer youth workers. The high-school-age workers will assist at community service events at the Multi Agency, Grant Township Food Cupboard, Hoopeston Public Library, Hoopeston Community Nursing Home, County Terrace and Hoopeston Area High School.

3.) a senior worker for the agency Thrift

Shop. The East Central Illinois Area Agency on Aging is cutting funding for one of two workers. The grant will keep the extra position and allow the shop to be open more hours.

4.) continue the Health Moms/Healthy Kids program which was due to be cut. The grant will serve 118 moms and 279 children, Shaffer said.

5.) Floor maintenance. The grant includes an allotment to have floors cleaned stripped and waxed twice in the next year.

This is the second year the Multi Agency has received a Blowitz-Ridgeway Foundation grant.

HMA also received a one-time grant from the Area Agency on Aging for a new computer system for assistant director Susan Redden, Shaffer

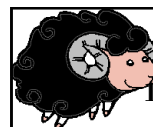



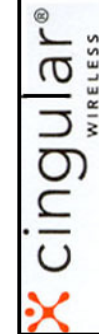
