Supplies continued from other side

school glue (no larger); 6 clear or white glue sticks; child's scissors (metal blades); 1 regular size box of facial tissues; school pencil box (cigar box style); paint shirt (any over-sized shirt); pair of white-soled gym shoes (to be left at school); school bag or back pack - no wheels; complete change of clothes (in a bag with the child's name on them)

All items should be marked with child's name. Items not on the list may be sent home.

Second Grade

4 solid glue sticks; 8 oz. bottle of Elmer's white paper glue; 2 pink block erasers; 2 boxes of 24 crayons (no larger, no glitter or fluorescent); pair Fiskars child's scissors (metal blades/dull tip); 2 pocket folders (no 3 ring binders); 1-2 boxes 200 count tissues; 1 8- or 12- pack colored pencils; pencil box (cigar box style); white-soled gym shoes to be left at school; paint shirt; 8 count wide tip markers; pack #2 pencils (sharpened, if possible) 2 spiral, non-perforated, wide-ruled notebooks.

Please mark all items with child's name. A note will be sent home when additional supplies are needed. Please no personal pencil sharpeners.

Third Grade

Please label all supplies
2 glue sticks; gym shoes (for inside use only); 4 1-gallon six freezer Ziploc bags; paint shirt; 4 pocket folders with pockets (solid color - no prongs); box 180 count or larger tissues; school scissors (Fiskars preferred);

2 pink block erasers; 12 - #2 wooden pencils (to be replaced as needed); 2 boxes of crayons (24 or smaller); washable markers; extra red pencil for math; colored pencils; 4 oz. bottle of white glue; 1 package wide ruled notebook paper. No Trapper Keepers. Subtraction and addition flash cards are suggested for home use first semester; multiplication flash cards are suggested for second semester.

Fourth Grade

8 oz. bottle of glue and 2 glue sticks; pink block eraser
#2 pencils (at least 5 to start); crayons; gym shoes (for inside use only); paint shirt; water-color markers; large box of tissues; wide-ruled, white, single sheet notebook paper (no spirals and no college ruled); pointed school scissors; large box colored pencils, 2 red pens; 3-ring binder/notebook, rings at least 2 inches in diameter; 2 1-gallon size freezer Ziploc bags.

Fifth Grade Classroom

Package of 200 sheet white wide-lined loose leaf paper; highlighter; 7 pocket folders; 2 folders with pockets & fasteners for 3 hole-punched sheets; 12 #2 pencils; 2 red pencils; pair white-soled gym shoes; large box tissues; assignment notebooks (John Greer will furnish the first one.)
