

Youngster's invention to get national attention on TV show

At Levi French's house, the bathroom nightlight shone into his older sister, Nikki's room so Levi did something about it. He invented Light & Go, a lighted toilet seat.

Levi, nine-year-old grandson of Terry and Sharon Prillaman of Rossville and son of Dr. Richard and Darla French of Marlboro, Conn., submitted his invention in the annual Invention Convention at Marlboro Elementary School. It won at the local level, did not win at the state level but is managing to gather national attention.

Levi and his Light & Go, along with two classmates and their inventions, are scheduled to be featured on The Tonight Show with Jay Leno next week. Their appearance is tentatively set for Tuesday, Aug. 10.

To create his invention, Levi found a baby

blue and green toilet at a dump near his home. After putting grooves in the seat, he affixed white rope lighting around it with hot glue but discovered the glue didn't still well. He found epoxy worked better.

The lights require electricity but are plugged into a GFI outlet "so nobody gets electrocuted," Levi said. The lights provide an added bonus to the female members of his home. "My sisters like it because the seat gets warm," he said.

Levi is not the only inventor in the family. Twin sister, Morgan, has designed two inventions and has received state recognition: a Pet Fold and Go which features a plastic container, piping and a lid that converts into a pet cage and the Easy Feed, a pipe that fits into a box of cat food and lever to dispense the food. "It gets just enough in there," Mor-

gan said.

Levi credits his grandfather. Phil French. with the inventive gene the twins share. Mr. French patented some of his inventions, Morgan said.

The family will travel to California and stay at the Los Angeles Hilton for Levi's appearance. Morgan may also appear with him. If so, the twins can display some of their other talents, like touching their noses with their tongues, wiggling their ears and doing belly rolls.

Big sister Nikki has other hopes for the trip. Their father's cousin appears on the television shows "Judging Amy" and "Vegas" and Nikki would like to see tapings of a show and maybe be
