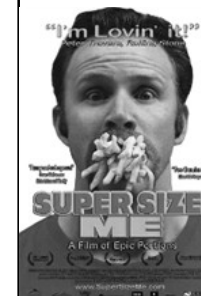

Wiscombe will perform the Broadway vocal "Vivez" from "The Scarlet Pimpernel" as her talent.

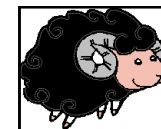
