Absentee voting hours extended

Hours for in-person absentee voting have been extending.

Vermilion County Clerk Lynn Foster's office will be open from 9 a.m.-noon on four Saturdays - Oct. 9, 16, 23 and 30.

Illinois law provides for absentee voting for those who expect to be absent from their county; those who are disabled or incapacitated, students, absent military and government personnel, people performing duties for an election authority or law enforcement, nursing home residents or those in health care facilities and those observing religious holidays.

Those who wish to vote absentee by mail should request an application as soon as possible. The voter must mail the completed application back in order to have a ballot sent by mail. The last day on which an absentee ballot may be mailed to a voter is Thursday, Oct. 28.

Voters who are permanently disabled may request an application for a special identification card entitling them to automatically receive absentee ballot applications for every election for five years.
