Packets for the library district are available now and may be circulated starting Oct. 27. Petitions and required forms may be filed beginning at 9:30 a.m. Jan. 17, 2005 through the end of business on Jan. 25, 2005.

Trustees Mark Conolly and Janet Crouch's terms are expiring. They are six-year terms.

In Rossville, petitions and other documents may be picked up beginning Oct. 27. Packets will be available for those running for mayor, clerk and trustees.

The terms of Mayor Terry Prillaman, Clerk Chris

Pearson and trustees Richard Birkey, Michael Clutter, Robert Merritt for four year terms and Kay Ritter for a two-year unexpired term will be up.

In Hoopeston, hopefuls may pick up their packets on Nov. 3. Positions to be on the ballot include mayor, city clerk, treasurer and four aldermen.

Those whose terms are expiring include Mayor Chalmers Flint, Clerk Gail Lane, Treasurer Edye Bookwalter and aldermen Rod Kaag in Ward 1, Carl Ankenbrand in Ward 2, Kevin Davis in Ward 3 and Bill Goodwine in Ward 4.
