Floral Hill Cemetery Chapel houses first wedding ceremony

Floral Hill has seen many family gatherings during its long history.

On Oct. 9, however, the cemetery's chapel was the site of a gathering of a different sort when Lealoni Garman and Tony Gress decided to exchange wedding yows there.

The couple believes the wedding is the first ever held in the chapel. "The (Hoopeston) Historical Society doesn't have a record of anyone ever getting married there," Loni Gress said.

The idea for a wedding in the chapel was the bride's. "(Former mayor) Bob (Ault) sent me out there for something and I said 'if I ever get married again - and I didn't plan on it because I was down on men at the time - that's where I want to do it," Loni Gress said.

Twenty-one people attended the ceremony. "That's about the max, I would say," Tony Gress said. His wife concurred. "You could probably get more in if everyone was standing but if you're going to sit, that's probably the limit."

Guests were surprised at the couple's choice of locations. "When we told them, they said 'in the **cemetery**?," Tony Gress said.

"My answer was 'where do you think Mann's Chapel is," Loni Gress said. "I couldn't believe the number of people who didn't know Floral Hill had a chapel."

The chapel was built in1889. William Silver was the contractor. Over the years, the chapel had fallen out of use and into disrepair. In about 1992, the historical society spearheaded the effort to update the building. The city and Silver Brothers also participated.

"It was a big mess," said historical society member Elizabeth Chorney. Mrs. Chorney's late husband,

Pete, did much of the work, including rewiring the chapel. The project was completed in 1994, she said.

For the ceremony, the Gresses added pew bows on chairs, a unity candle on the altar and an oil candle atop an antique pump organ. "It was nothing fancy," Tony Gress said. "It was just simple."

The Rev. Lewis Mershon performed the ceremony. Brenda McVicker and Gregg Gress stood up with the couple.

Loni, 53, and Tony, 52, have known each other since they were about four years old and have dated for the past 12 years. "We've seen the good, the bad and the ugly," Loni Gress said.

Other couples may consider using the chapel, which the city oversees. "They've never rented it out (for a wedding) because nobody's ever asked," Loni Gress said.


