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## Voters in Hoopeston, Rossville pass school referendums

DANVILLE—The majority of Hoopeston Area voters approved paying higher taxes toward the district's education fund, while Rossville-Alvin voters have approved deactivating their high school.

According to preliminary figures, Hoopeston Area voters in Vermilion and Iroquois counties approved a tax increase of 90 cent per \$100 assessed valuation. Unofficial totals for both counties put the vote at 1,608 for and 1,220 against.

In Rossville-Alvin, the board held five public meetings, explaining why the district's high school should be deactivated and students allowed to choose between Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning schools. Unofficial tallies in that race put the count at

enda mean Hoopeston Area will gain some of Rossville-Alvin's 114 high school students and an estimated \$6,072 per student in tuition for those new students. R-A students must decide by Dec. 15 which school they will attend to allow Hoopeston Area and Bismarck-Henning to incorporate a like percentage of Rossville-Alvin teachers into each district.

The 90 cent tax increase for the education fund will raise Hoopeston Area's tax rate from \$3.76 to \$4.66 per \$100 assessed valuation. The tax is expected to add about \$150 to the tax bill of an owner of a \$50,000 house.

Residents' taxes will go up even more after county voters approved a one tenth of one percent tax to fund the nursing home. A final total was not available at press time but at one point during the tallying, support for the
