New York credit counseling company interested in Willdon

A Long Island-based credit counseling company is interested in purchasing the Willdon Building.

At Wednesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Alderman Bill Goodwine said a representative of the unnamed company toured the building last week.

The three-year-old company would hire 25-30 local people to be credit counselors and would pay "pretty good" wages, he said.

Goodwine said he checked on the company and learned it is in good standing with the New York State Banking Authority and has applied certification with ISO, an international standards agency.

Because the company will need only one floor of the

building it has been talking with telemarketing companies in New York about renting space, Goodwine said.

A representative of another company is expected in Hoopeston next week to look at the building.

Robert Alcaez, representing a third business interested in the building, was scheduled to speak at the meeting but was unable to attend.

In other business, the council:

- accepted a \$32.95 bid from Berry's Garden Center, Danville, for perpetual care urns. No local bids were received.

- rejected a \$10 bid for a used ambulance.

- heard from Alderwoman Nancy Stipp about participating with other communities in a program promoting the historic Dixie Highway, including a road rally the third Saturday of each June. The group meets in Danville with another meeting set for Nov. 17.

- approved participating in the Illinois Municipal League Risk Management Association's min/max program. Under the program Hoopeston will save about \$16,500 on insurance but will raise its out-of-pocket expense range to \$65,000-\$97,000, Goodwine said. Last year, the city had only \$10,000 in claims, far below the \$65,000 minimum.

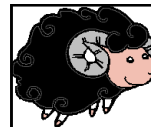
