## **Hoopeston Health Center offers programs for children**

Hoopeston Regional Health Center is offering two programs for children.

In conjunction with the monthly Well Baby Clinic, the health center will also offer a lead screening for children ages six months to six years.

Both will be held from 9-11 a.m. Thursday at the Charlotte Ann Russell Medical Center, 801 E. Orange, Hoopeston.

Lead is very poisonous to people and can be especially harmful to children. More than one million children may have blood levels that require medical attention and more than one million children may be somewhat mentally or emotionally impaired by lead exposure.

Lead can be found in paint, water, potter, dishes, soil, solder, mini blinds, furniture, antiques, food can seams, candle wicks, jewelry, toys, Mexican candy and electronic assemblies.

The screening will be done free for children who qualify; for others, insurance will be billed.

The Well Baby Clinic is free for children ages birth to school age. Youngsters will be examined, weighed, measured and given needed immunizations. Freewill donations are accepted.
