Lockport business owner buys former Burton Motors building

An old Hoopeston building has a new owner.

The former Burton Motors building at 701 E. Main was purchased by Mark and Christopher Shoudis, owner of The Honda Specialists in Lockport. The shop is a father and son effort focusing on Honda and Accura repairs, Mark Shoudis said.

The two are currently repairing the building, which included replacing window glass that had been broken out and re-

pairing the roof. "We're working on it little by little, inch by inch," he said. When repairs are completed, the two plan to initially use the building for storing car parts and hope to eventually open a used car lot specializing in Hondas and Accuras.

The high cost of storage in the Chicago area caused Shoudis to look outside the city for a place to store parts. "I basically got tired of paying someone else's mortgage," Shoudis said. "If you deal with Honda parts on the Internet, it doesn't matter if they're stored in Chicago or Hoopeston.

Shoudis heard about Hoopeston from family members who moved to Claytonville. "I used to think 'why did they move to Claytonville," he said. After visiting several times and coming to Hoopeston on more than one occasion, "I kind of fell in love with the middle of nowhere." he said.

Shoudis said people he has met here have been friendly. He also cited the low crime rate and low real estate values as pluses for the community.

Shoudis, 45, has spent nearly 20 years working on Hondas and Accords. About five years ago, he quit the job he had and with his son, opened The Honda Specialists. In the last five years, he said, they have worked to expand their customer base and, in the process, are running out of room in their Lockport location.

Shoudis hopes to be storing parts here within a year. Plans for the car lot are further down the road, he said.

The family also hopes to buy a home in Hoopeston. "You have a lot of nice homes here," he said. "Here, I would need \$200,000 just to get a cardboard house. There, you can get a really nice house for \$200,000."


