Community Fund approves allocations, more funds sought

Fund drive about \$10,000 short

The United Community Fund of Grant Township approved allocations of almost \$30,000 at their meeting Wednesday.

The amount is nearly \$10,000 less than was asked for from 16 area agencies, resulting in most agencies receiving 90 percent of their requests

The Community Fund's allocations committee recommended eliminating a request from the

Red Cross for \$3,000. Two other agencies, the Honeywell and John Greer after-school programs, did not request money this year.

Three agencies - The Grant Township Food Cupboard, Hoopeston Multi Agency and Community Center - were funded at 100 percent because of the number of people and the needs they meet in the community.

Lance Raver, previous Community Fund president, stated previously that funding is down because of cuts in industry. The projected total for the 2005 fund drive is \$7,544. Other divisions and projected totals are: schools, \$4,278.60; professional, \$2,700; residential \$385; financial, \$1,981; retail \$895; churches \$650; misc. \$2,481.81; and City of Hoopeston employees \$1,010.

The Community Fund has carried a surplus for emergencies for the last few years, due to successful fund drives, but board members said that surplus - earmarked for emergencies in the community - will be used up in about two years at current collection levels.

To increase funds, the Community Fund is seeking corporate contributions, including ones from Pamida and ConAgra and will be the receiving agency of a Feb. 26 fundraiser at Pla-Mor Lanes. A Rock 'N Bowl will be held then and will include a silent auction and 50/50 drawing. Proceeds from the event will






