Vermilion County Crimestoppers gets aggressive on crime

Vermilion County Crimestoppers is getting more aggressive about getting information leading to the arrest of criminals.

Keith Sousa, president of the Crimestoppers board and Danville Police Sgt. Steve Swisher, liaison to Crimestoppers, were the featured speakers at Monday's Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch.

"We're trying to get the word out because a lot of people don't even know we exist," Sousa said.

Crimestoppers, which provides rewards for anonymous tips on crimes, was formed in 1988 but did not become really active until 1992. For approximately the last year, the group has been working hard to increase its exposure as well as its funding to better pay those who provide tips. Sousa, who has been on the board since 1998, said the current board decided then that "either we're going to make it work or we're going to get out of the business."

Crimestoppers receives its funding through contributions from donors and fundraising activities. Judges may also impose an additional \$1 on traffic and misdemeanor cases and \$2 on felony convictions to go to the program. County judges are imposing that fine more often, Sousa said. The first check

Crimestoppers received from fines was for \$119 - "it was enough to pay the phone bill," he said. Now Crimestoppers receives about \$3,000 annually from

With more money coming in, more money can go out for tips. From 2001-03, Crimestoppers paid a total of \$650. In 2004, the amount jumped to \$1,275.

Sousa said 90 percent of the tips called in come from other criminals. "That's the way it works and it's fine," he said.

People who call with tips are able to remain anonymous. "We never know who it is and we don't care," Sousa said.

Calls come in on a rotary dial phone without caller ID. Tipsters are given an identification number and call again after the monthly Crimestoppers board meeting to find out if their tips merit payment, how much and where and when the money will be delivered. Crimestoppers board members deliver the money - paid in cash - and police officers are never involved.

Hoopeston has its own Crimestoppers number - 283-4411 - that rings in the Danville office but.



Vermilion County residents to be surveyed on health issues

Vermilion County residents will have an opportunity to speak out about their health status and needs over the next month. Northern Illinois University's Public Opinion Laboratory, under the direction of the Illinois Department of Public Health, will conduct a telephone survey of adult health behaviors in Vermilion County over the next month. Those asked to respond to the random sample of households must be 18 years of age and older and Vermilion County residents. "The data we receive from the Behavior Risk Factor Surveillance System survey allows us an opportunity to better understand and respond to needs within our county," said Vermilion County Health Department Administrator Stephen Laker.

"Illinois is one of the few states in the nation consistently obtaining this type of valuable, county-level data, enabling health departments and other local agencies to respond more efficiently and effectively to community needs," said Community Relations Coordinator Linda Bolton. Laker agreed, saying, "With limited budgets, we all must do a better job of identifying needs and understanding the health-habits of residents in our community".

Because there can be uncertainty about the legitimacy of survey calls, Laker and Bolton encourage residents who are contacted to question the caller's validity. Individuals being called should feel comfortable discussing their concerns with the caller, and should be provided with a toll-free telephone number to verify the legitimacy of the call. "All information obtained during the survey will be kept confidential," Laker said. "We will not be given data regarding individuals," Laker said, "We will receive only a summary report of the total responses."
