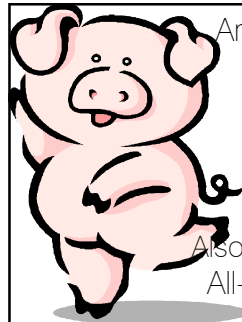

HA jazz ensembles get high marks at Purdue Jazz Festival

Hoopeston Area's high school and middle school jazz bands got high honors at the recent Purdue Jazz Festival.

The middle school ensemble earned the Outstanding Performance Award and the Judges Award, making them the highest-scoring middle school at the event.

The group performed "C Jam Blues" and "A Night in Tunisia" by Duke Ellington and Dizzy Gillespie, respectively.

Additionally, Sam Umbanhowar (drums) and Matthew Morgeson (tenor saxophone) received outstanding soloist awards. Morgeson was named Outstanding Middle School Soloist for the festival.

The high school ensemble received the Judge's Award. Their score was the highest of 17 bands in their performance room.

The group performed "Cute" by Count Basie.

Andrew Hodge (drums) and Patrick Sheppard (alto saxophone) were named outstanding soloists.

Both bands participated in the small schools category at the event, held Jan. 29-30.
