Indiana police arrest area residents for meth, ingredients

WEST LAFAYETTE, IND—Five Illinois residents, including three from Hoopeston and one from Rossville, were arrested late Monday and early Tuesday on methamphetamine-related charges.

The Lafayette Journal and Courier reported Wednesday that the arrests were made after two unrelated traffic stops. The first stop was made at approximately 11:30 p.m. Monday after an off-duty police officer saw a man acting suspiciously at a pharmacy and reported it to on-duty officers.

A short time later, police stopped a green Ford minivan and allegedly found 110 pseudoephedrine (cold) tablets and other ingredients used to make meth. See METH on other side


Hoopeston police release 2004 crime statistics, comparison

Last year was one that saw some crimes increasing and others decreasing in Hoopeston. Crime statistics for 2004, released by the Hoopeston Police Department, show fewer sexual assaults, thefts, auto thefts, acts of vandalism and traffic accidents. Numbers for murder, robbery, domestic battery, aggravated battery, burglary and arson rose in 2004. Increases and decreases were minor in most categories but the number of acts of vandalism

the number of acts of vandalism dropped markedly, from 116 in 2003 to 86 last year. Chief Mark Drollinger credited officers' strategic patrol with lowering the number.

Drollinger believes there is a correlation between one statistic and meth use in the community. The number of domestic batteries was at 28, up from 24 in 2003. "I



have to think domestic batteries goes along with our meth problem," he said.

Police report many crimes on a Uniform Crime Report to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The FBI then releases reports to police departments showing statistics for those crimes.

The 2004 Crime Index/Crime Rate Comparison for 2004/2003 shows that:

• Hoopeston's population decreased from 5,874 to 5,825.

• The Total Crime Index rose 1.9 percent, from 211 in 2003 to 215 last year.

• Arrests were up 42.9 percent, with 50 last year compared to 35 in 2003.

• Total drug arrests remained stable with 45 each year. Arrests for violations of the Cannabis Control Act went down one, to 18 last year and down two - to 20 - for the Controlled Substances Act.
