

Incumbent, three challengers seek Hoopeston Ward 3 seat

Four people want to be the one to represent Hoopeston's Third Ward voters after the April 5 election.

Incumbent Kevin Davis is being challenged by Bill Crusinberry, Tom Garrison and Penny Blakely.

Crusinberry, 55, is seeking public office for the first time. The lifetime Hoopeston area resident attended Wellington schools, graduated from Hoopeston High School and earned an associate's degree in mechanical engineering from then-Danville Junior College. He is currently employed at Crop Production Services.

"Being a life resident of Hoopeston area, I feel that I have a good knowledge of Hoopeston's history," he said. "We should consider Hoopeston's past, both successes and failures, as we plan for the future of our city. I feel that I will evaluate all available information before making decisions that not only will be good for the present but will reach into the future of Hoopeston."

Three main issues face Hoopeston, he said, including maintaining city services, jobs and Tax Increment Financing (TIF) income.

He believes the city must use projected reve-

nues to formulate a balanced budget to maintain services and create jobs by promoting neighboring communities and promoting Hoopeston as a quality place to raise a family, focusing on its pluses, including schools, hospital, library, parks, locally-owned retail and affordable cost of living.

Garrison, 67, attended high school for two years and is retired from General Motors where he served on the bargaining committee for 13 years and as a United Auto Workers trustee for 12 years.

He has previously run for Ward 3 alderman.

If elected, Garrison said he would "work with city council members and with senators and congressmen to get jobs to want to come to Hoopeston and keep what businesses we already have. I am readily available and willing to meet with people on any reasonable complaint."

Top issues facing the city include sewer and water problems, especially on the northeast side of town. He would apply for grants to replace the existing sewer system with much larger sewers to carry excess water.
