Ordinance to be enforced

I have been asked to start enforcement of this ordinance because of the problems with grass clippings causes with the City Sewer system.

Our citizens may or may not be aware of the ordinance that prohibits the depositing grass clippings

into the streets or into water ways that may carry this to our sanitary sewer system. This is really becoming a problem for our city and we need to stop this practice before we have completely blocked system and it causes a major expense in repair bills for our city and our citizens.

City Ordinance 8.04.040: Unlawful deposits of garbage or waste matter described. It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to cast, place,

sweep, or deposit with the limits of the city any garbage or other waste matter or rubbish in such a manner that it may be carried or deposited by the action of the wind, rain or snow into or upon street, sidewalk, alley, sewer, parkway or other public place or unto any occupied or unoccupied premises with the limits of the City of Hoopeston.

The fine for this can be any where from \$25 to maximum of \$500 dollars under city ordinance
