Police officers exonerated by Hoopeston Police Commission

Two Hoopeston police officers who were the subject of a citizen complaint have been exonerated by the Hoopeston Police Commission.

The commission held an informal hearing Friday regarding a complaint filed by Jerry Mullen, father of Terry Mullen. Terry Mullen, 48, was arrested March 11, charged with driving under the influence, fleeing and eluding police and failing to report an accident to police.

The elder Mullen's complaint alleged that two officers, who were not publicly identified, "did not apprehend (Terry Mullen) in an appropriate manner," said

At Friday's hearing, commissioners heard from Jerry Mullen and Chief Mark Drollinger who reviewed the audio tape of conversation between officers and the on-duty dispatcher during the incident; the reports submitted by the officers and a written statement from a representative of the University of Illinois Police Training Institute.

Drollinger reviewed the arrest the PTI representative. "He saw nothing that the police officers did that was out of line," Freeland said. The PTI report "probably helped us arrive at our conclusion."

equipment for the soccer group, including a line machine and paint, corner flags and netting and anchors for goals, Welch said.


