Money to ease nursing shortage part of governor's plan

CHAMPAIGN—A plan to help curb a regional nursing shortage was touted by state officials Friday at the University of Illinois.

Gov. Rod Blagojevich unveiled an economic development plan for East Central Illinois as part of his Opportunity Returns program.

One of the components of the plan includes a \$180,000 Critical Skills Shortage Initiative grant to ease the nursing shortage.

Locally, Hoopeston Regional **BLAGOJEVICH** HealthcareDanville Area Community College will benefit from the grant, which was officially announced May 19.

Other hospitals included in the area are Provena Covenant Medical Center, Carle Foundation Hospital, Gibson Area Hospital, Iroquois Memorial Hospital, Veterans Administration, Illiana Healthcare Systems, Prairie Center Health Systems. The other educational partner is Parkland College.

Local men lead officers from three police agencies on chase

WATSEKA—Two men were being held in Iroquois County Sunday after leading officers from three agencies on a chase through two counties.

Austin E. Dale, 26, of 203 S. Donovan, Wellington and Jackie E. Winchester, 28, of 303 Henderson, Rossville, were taken to the Iroquois County jail after an incident that started at 11:21 p.m.

Speaking Friday at the iCyt building in the University of Illinois Research Park, Blagjevich outlined his plan for region, which includes Vermilion, Iroquois, Champaign, Piatt, Douglas and Ford counties.

The 32-point plan focuses on five areas: business attraction, promoting entrepreneurship, strengthening job training, supporting infrastructure and investments in agriculture, energy and the envi-

ronment.

Champaign will be the big winner in the multi-million dollar plan with several projects started to planned for the U of I.

Besides the Critical Skills Shortage Initiative grant, two other Hoopeston projects are included in Blagojevich's plan, including money to Silgan Containers to upgrade equipment and the brown-
