Hoopeston Area schools registration underway this week

Hoopeston Area students will return to classes in less than a month. To get them ready, officials have announced registration and other information.

Registration will begin Tuesday, Aug. 9 for grades seven, nine and 10. High school students whose last names begin with A-L may register from 8:30-11 a.m. and from M-Z from 12:30-3 p.m.

Students in CARE, ECSE and kindergarten-sixth grade (Maple, Honeywell and John Greer), will register from 1-6 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 10 at the middle school.

Students in grades 8, 11 and 12 will also register Aug. 10. Students whose last names begin with A-L may register from 8:30-11 a.m. and from M-Z from 1-6 p.m. Extended hours are offered for those unable to register earlier.

Late registration, for those unable to register earlier in the week, will be held from 9-11 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 11.

Orientations for new students have been set.

Seventh grade orientation will be held at 6 p.m. Aug. 9 in the high school auditorium, followed at 7 p.m. by orientation for incoming freshmen and new Rossville-Alvin students who will attend Hoopeston Area.

Kindergarten orientation will be held from 6-7 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 16 at Maple. Students are asked to bring school supplies with them to orientation.

First attendance day for students will be Aug. 19 for half a day. ECSE students and parents will meet with teachers at appointed times.

Aug. 22 marks the first day lunches will be served. This is the first attendance day for ECSE students. Also, CARE students and parents should meet with teachers at appointed times. Their first day to attend will be Aug. 23.

Students will be dismissed early through Sept. 2. Grade school students will be dismissed at 2:05 p.m. and middle/high school students will get out at 2:20 p.m. Normal dismissal will begin Sept. 6.
