# Chairman balances family fun, finances for corn festival

Todd Rush, chairman of this year's National Sweet Corn Festival, has been doing a balancing act.

The festival, still recouping losses from heavy rains two years ago, needs to provide entertainment to draw people but needs to not drain the financial resources of the Hoopeston Jaycees, sponsors of the Labor Day weekend event.

To reach that balance, this year's festival is geared more towards area residents.

For example, the \$3 gate fee was waived for opening night. "I think Thursday should be a free night," Rush said. "It's mostly for kids with the bracelet night." Because Thursday is a school night, attendance is usually limited to people living in a 20-mile radius, he said.

The number of bands performing has been cut in an effort to curb expenses but those bands that are featured have local ties. Tons of Fun Band, which includes area musicians will play Friday night. Saturday night, Champaign-based Blind Pilot will be featured. The band has had local exposure in Rossville, Rush said.

Gone this year is the band shell. Instead, Bob Bohm's Family Survivor and Magic show will be moved closer to the corn line to provide entertainment for those waiting in line for corn. The act was a crowd-pleaser at last year's festival and more frequent performances were scheduled for this year.

Another favorite, the petting zoo and pony and camel rides, are returning and a clown will walk around McFerren Park welcoming visitors.

No festival would be complete without sweet corn and a whopping 32 tons of it will be delivered to Hoopeston over the weekend. Years ago, the corn was grown locally and the expense of it was mini-
