Hoopeston Area high, middle school miss adequate progress

Two Hoopeston Area schools failed to make adequate yearly progress based on state standards.

Scores released at Thursday night's Hoopeston Area School Board meeting show all schools met standards in reading but last year's eighth and 11th graders failed to meet standards in math.

To meet the standards, schools had to attain a 47.5 percentile in the two subjects. Maple School received

72.1 and 90.7, respectively in reading and math; Honeywell scores were 65.9 and 85.9 and John Greer, 51.4 and 75.7.

Middle schoolers scored 65.3 in reading and 41.2 in math, while high school students scored 48.5 in reading and 31.8 in math.

2004 to the 47.5 percent this year.

One reason why Hoopeston Area did not meet the target is because special education students are tested at the same level as other students. Up to two percent of modest achieving students could be discounted from statistics but Hoopeston Area does not have enough of those students in each building, said Superintendent Mark Conolly.

Superintendents from smaller districts, like Hoopeston Area, have written to the Illinois State Board of Education about the situation but it has not been changed, he said.

Additionally, Hoopeston Area serves a high percentage of low-income students which also affects the statis-

The state statistics show one picture but Hank Hornbeck, high school principal, said juniors and seniors taking the ACT test paint another picture. Last year, the average score for Hoopeston students taking the test was 20.3, up from 20.2 the previous year.

It was last year that the high school was taken off the state's academic watch list after meeting standards for two consecutive years.
