Only two open to the general public will be held outside Danville and Hoopeston is scheduled to have one of them.

Clinics for high-risk individuals are expected to begin Oct. 17. "We anticipate receiving sufficient influenza vaccine by that date," said Public Health Administrator Steve Laker.

The health department delayed announcing clinics until they received some assurance the vaccine they ordered would arrive on time. "Given the challenges local health departments faced last year," Laker said, "we thought it best to delay releasing the specifics about clinics until now."

All high-risk clinics will be held at the health department office, 200 S. College, Danville. They will be held from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Oct. 17, 19, 21, and 24.

High-risk people include those ages 65 and older, with or without chronic health conditions; people under age 65 with chronic health conditions (diabetes, heart or kidney disease, asthma, cancer, HIV/AIDS or anything impacting the immune system)

Pregnant women are also at risk, and they should see their healthcare provider about flu shots. Parents of children under age 2 are encouraged to call the health department's Immunizations at (217) 431-2662 for information about flu shots for children. Also at risk are those in long term care, direct care health providers, and anyone who is a household contact of very young children, or those who provide childcare for infants (under age 2).

If enough vaccine is available, immunizations will be offered to the general public, including a clinic from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 25 at the Methodist Church, 403 E. Main St., Hoopeston.

The other clinic outside Danville will be held from

12 p.m.-4 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 27 at Trinity United Church of Christ, 311 Moses Ave., Westville.

Other clinics scheduled for the general public will be held from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Oct. 31, Nov. 1, 7, 14, 21, 22, 23, 28 and 30 at the health department office.

Laker said the health department does not expect to return to offering clinics at multiple sites around the county anytime soon. "Unfortunately," he said, "Changes in availability of vaccine, when and how we receive it, and staffing costs have seriously impacted our ability to offer flu clinics at multiple sites as we have done for the last 30 years."

Costs will also be going up. A flu immunization is expected to cost \$28 this year. Laker said the Medicare reimbursement rate determines the charge set by the health department. "We already know the cost of flu vaccine has increased over 30%," he said. Medicare cards must be presented at the time of immunization.

Shipments from British vaccine manufacturer Chiron Corporation were halted last year, creating a shortage, and causing the health department and others to eliminate many of their flu shot clinics. A shortage is not expected this year, but vaccine is being delivered in batches, rather than in single shipments. Laker said the health department has ordered 4,000 doses of vaccine for the coming flu season.

Anyone with mobility issues who has difficulty getting into the health department building is advised to call the health department at (217) 431-2662 to prearrange for a nurse to go out to the vehicle and give the flu shot.

The following flu schedule is subject to change, if vaccine shipments are delayed. Health department officials advise everyone to check their website at <u>www.vchd.org</u> for new information, or call them at (217) 431-2662.
