David Elliott began his duties Oct. 1. He and his wife, CJ, plan to live in Hoopeston and become involved in community activities.

The position allows Elliott to return to his small-town roots. Born in Kentucky, he grew up in Middlesboro, Ken. At 17, he joined the United States Air Force, serving for 11 years as a Tech Sgt. Feeling a need to finish his education, Elliott completed college with a degree in business administration and

accounting and immediately entered the Air Force again as a second lieutenant, serving in Vietnam in the medical corps. As a result of his service in the Air Force, he received the Bronze Star.

After completing his tour in the Air Force, Elliott attended Washington School of Medicine in St. Louis, Mo., receiving a Master of health administration.

Elliott brings to Hoopeston an entrepreneurial spirit and is looking forward to working with the staff and board on various projects. He also has ideas for what he

Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital was started in 1962 and serves Hoopeston and surrounding communities in Vermilion County and southern


Iroquois County.
