Museum's plan would bring Woodstock to Willdon Building

The Beatles are coming - maybe.

Organizers of the South Elgin-based The Sixties Museum have toured the Willdon Building as a possible site for an expanded museum.

At Tuesday night's Hoopeston City Council meeting, Alderman Bill Goodwine said a group from the museum toured the Willdon Building on Oct. 22.

Skeptical at first, Goodwine said he did not want to take the group on the tour, preferring to watch a Notre Dame football game on television. But after touring with the group, Goodwine admitted his interest is piqued.

"What caught my attention was they wanted to see the Civic Center because they said if they're going to have a 60s museum, we've got to have 60s concerts," he said.

The museum currently pays homage to the 60s online but wants to find a home for exhibits about the civil rights struggle, the Viet Nam war, the music and all things 60s.

Goodwine said organizers plan an interactive, ever-changing museum which will include a traveling museum to take the history of the decade to schools.

And while organizers hope to someday have a building bigger than the Willdon, "it's a perfect first step," Goodwine said.

Organizers estimated 200,000 people per year would tour the museum. "I could get pretty excited if they could get 10 percent of that," he said.

Why such a museum would locate in Hoopeston was a question on one alderman's mind. "That would be kind of like putting a McDonald's in Cheneyville, wouldn't it," said Ed Lotz.

Goodwine explained that museum organizers said the mobility of our society would make Hoopeston a

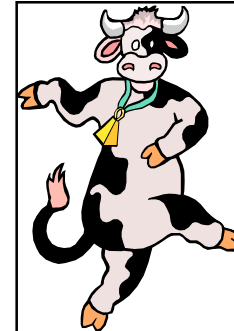

good place for the museum.

A decision on whether the museum will open here "is not imminent by any means," Goodwine said. However, "it was an interesting day."

More information on the museum is available at www.60smuseum.org.

In other business, the council:

- Approved a \$573 bid from Lee Cox for the northern tract of the former Baer's Trailer Park. At the Oct. 18 meeting, the action failed to meet the three-fourths majority needed to sell land. Tuesday, with the entire council and mayor voting, it passed 7-2.

Cox will open Cox' Memorials and Boulders on the property.

- Approved using Hoopeston Regional Health Center to do city drug testing. The city has been using Midwest Truckers Association at a cost of about \$7,500 annually. The same services through Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital will cost about

\$3,200, Goodwine said.

- Approved participating in the Illinois Municipal League Risk Management Association min/max insurance program for the second year. The program could save nearly \$17,000 if claims remain low.

- Learned from Alderman Carl Ankenbrand that two of the three swans donated to Hoopeston by the Rantoul Parks Department are missing. The pair had been on Harold Cox' pond but have flown away. The third swan has had its wings clipped, Ankenbrand said. Anyone who spots the birds is asked to call the parks department, 283-5813.

- Heard from Ankenbrand that the city is seeking bids on new energy efficient windows for the civic center. Bids will be opened at 9:30 a.m. Dec. 5. Specs are available at city hall and questions may be directed to parks superintendent Eugene Warner.

- Learned from Alderman Bill Crusinberry that a 100-year-old water main on Market broke last week.
