wrote Witty that Americans do not get an accurate picture of the war from reporters. "The media has painted only a bad picture of what's going on here," Witty read, adding that the Iraqi people are happy to be experiencing democracy.

The soldiers "are dedicated to the mission," Smoker wrote. Injured service people "want to get better so they can get back to their units. It's awesome dedication and it's awesome to watch."

Witty talked about his passion for the V.F.W. "What makes me so passionate? I guess it's because I don't want anyone to forget."

He also spoke about the need for service organizations such as the V.F.W. and the American Legion, to support active soldiers, support veterans and fight for veterans' rights.
