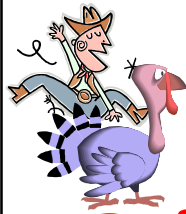

## **Women practice early detection, receive remembrance gifts**

"Early Detection is the Best Protection," is a phrase that 105 women practiced as they all were taking "Good Care of Themselves" by having their yearly mammograms. Approximately half of the women went one step further and had a bone density scan as part of their health wellness plan.

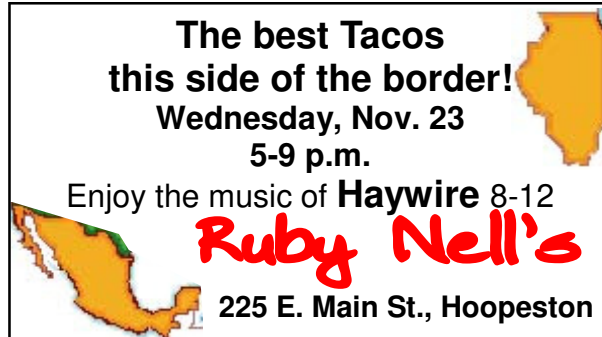
