She's not Sophia Loren, however. She is Rheia, the newest member of the Hoopeston Police Department. Rheia is a Cane (pronounced "Connie") Corso, an Italian Mastiff who is Morgan's canine partner. Morgan introduced the dog at Monday's Hoopeston

Morgan became interested in mastiffs through his wife, Lynn, a mastiff rescue volunteer. She, however, was unfamiliar with the breed. "When I told her, she said 'a Connie what?," Morgan said.

He researched the breed, which is smaller and more agile than most mastiffs, and came upon Tom Hockett, an Ohio breeder. Morgan explained the department's finances and Hockett volunteered to donate a dog, valued at \$1,000 to \$2,000, to the department. "Out of the goodness of his heart...he told me he would donate Rheia to me, which was just an amazing gift," Morgan said.

Morgan traveled to Ohio to select his pup and chose his companion, the runt of the litter. "She was the most active," he said. Hockett, he said, used a broom to play with the pups. "Rheia wouldn't let the broom alone, which told me she had drive," Morgan said. "Of course now I can't keep a broom in my house."

Rheia - named after the goddess, Rheia, Zeus' mother - came to Hoopeston May 16 at seven and a half weeks old. At nine weeks, she and Morgan started obedience training with Vermilion County Sheriff's Deputy Chuck Leverich. Then Rheia was trained in narcotics detection and can locate marijuana, crack, cocaine, heroin and "most important for our town, methamphetamine," Morgan said, adding Rheia is one of few canines trained to detect meth.

Rheia may also be trained in other areas, such as finding missing children, but one area in which she won't be trained is bomb detection. "She scratches when she hits (on something)," Morgan said. "You wouldn't want her scratching a bomb."

The ritual starts when Morgan is preparing for work. Rheia is kept away from him until he is ready. A pep talk comes next and then the duo is ready to roll. "She knows when she gets in the car, she has to have her game face on," he said.

Work is one thing. Home is something else entirely. "At home, she plays like a nine-month-old dog," Morgan said. "She demands a lot of attention." She is also good with the Morgans' three children.

Cane Corsos were originally Italian farm dogs. Their loyalty drew attention from the Italian military which began using them. Loyalty is a trait that the breed still has, being "extremely protective of their family, their master. The dogs "have the ability to detect a good heart

Rheia currently weighs about 65 lbs. When full grown, she will weigh approximately 75-80 lbs. "She'll be more beefy than big," Morgan said.

While Hockett donated the dog, Morgan has donated all costs since getting Rheia, including training, veterinarian bills and things like dog food. He estimates he has nearly \$2,000 invested in his partner but said it's a small price to pay to give something back to the community.

"Not only is it good for me and good for the department, it's good for the community," Morgan said, adding he was offered a job in the Chicago area but turned it down. "I don't want to be anywhere but here."
