An open letter to the community about assessment tests

Editor's Note: The following, submitted by Superintendent Mark Conolly, discusses student assessment testing which will be occurring in the district in March and April.

March and April is state-mandated student assessment time. All Illinois assessment tests are aligned with the Illinois Learning Standards and federal (NCLB) No Child Left Behind requirements

In Hoopeston Area CUSD #11, assessment is a balanced ongoing process that focuses on what students need to know and be able to do. The assessment system provides direction for effective teaching and learning. This system provides an ongoing monitoring process for addressing student achievement. Assessments are aligned with the Illinois Learning Standards and are designed to meet the following objectives:

- to measure the academic growth of students throughout the school year;
- to chart the academic progress of students from year to year;
- to identify students who need special assistance;
- to help students set personal achievement goals;
- to assist teachers in designing instruction;
- to help schools set school improvement goals for achievement:
- to help the District evaluate and improve educational programs.

The two major state mandated assessment tools that are used by CUSD #11are the Illinois Standards Assessment Test (ISAT) and the Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE). The ISAT assessment addresses elementary and middle school students, while the PSAE assessment addresses high school students. Our educators are trained in analyzing students testing data to obtain a broad look at student growth. This provides a comprehensive view of our students, so that challenging yet realistic achievement goals can be set for each student.

Illinois Standards Assessment Test, March 20 – 31 (Elementary and Middle School)

This assessment determines the school's and district's progress in meeting the Illinois Learning Standards. This test is administered in March and starting in 2006, all students will take tests in reading and mathematics in each grade level. Science will be given in grades 4 and 7. The test has four levels of performance scoring:

Academic Warning: This student demonstrates major gaps in learning and cannot apply knowledge and skills

Below Standards: This student demonstrates basic knowledge and skills with some learning gaps which limit application.

Meets Standards: This student demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills and applies information to solve problems.

Exceeds Standards: This student demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills which is applied creatively to solve problems.

Prairie State Achievement Examination, April 26, 27 (High School Students)

This assessment measures the achievement of grade 11 students relative to the Illinois Learning Standards for reading, mathematics, and science. The PSAE includes three components: (1) an Illinois State Board of Education developed science assessment; (2) the ACT Assessment, which includes reading, English, mathematics and science tests; and (3) two WorkKeys assessment (Reading for Information and Applied Mathematics) The levels of performance scoring are the same as the ISAT.

Under NCLB, schools, districts and states must meet target goals each year to achieve what's called "Adequate Yearly Progress" (AYP). This year that goal
