

Grant Township officials show off building with open house

It was an old-fashioned barn raising atmosphere Tuesday as Grant Township officials showed off the township's new garage.

The 60'x120' building played host to scores of people who feasted on barbecue and fixings to mark construction.

Township and county dignitaries were joined by Rep. Shane Cultra (R) and vendors who helped make the building become a reality.

Trustees approved new construction in December. In January, bids were opened and by early February, construction had started.

struction had started.

The structure has 3,840 sq. ft. of floor space with a 576 sq. ft. office area and an 18'x88' lean-to for storage. It has a natural radiant tube heating system for the shop area. Cost of the building was approximately \$185,000.

Many local businesses helped in the garage's construction, including Silver Bros. with concrete; Sheridan Appliances, heating and air conditioner; Musk Mechanical, plumbing; Ross Electric, electrical; Voyles Construction, septic system; and Community Bank, finance-
