State's attorney says he has necessary experience to judge

Frank Young believes his tenure as Vermilion County State's Attorney makes him amply qualified to be the next circuit judge.

Young, a Republican, is running against Nancy Fahey in the Nov. 7 election. He was the featured speaker at the October 10 Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting.

Serving as state's attorney is "probably the hardest thing I've ever done," Young said. While state's attorney, Young has personally prosecuted the 23 murder trials in the last six years. "That's more than we've ever had in a comparable period of time," he said.

With the same amount of staff as in 1999, Young's office has seen 150 more felony cases this year than then, he said, adding many of the felonies now include violence.

He attributed the violence to an increase in methamphetamine use among county residents and an influx of people from Chicago housing projects. Houses and apartments are being rented to people who used to live in the Robert Taylor Homes or Cabrini Green. "It's not necessarily the tenants, but their brothers, cousins and other family members who come down and think they can run all over us," he said. "They bring guns and tend to shoot them a little more quickly than we've ever known before."

As for meth users, Young has pushed for even first time offenders to remain in jail until trial, then hopefully to inpatient rehab. "I'm of the opinion that they need that time to get off the drugs," he said.

When drug use or any other crime is coupled with violence, "we draw the line," he said. "You become a violent person or you become armed with a firearm, you jump the level."

Some have said meth use is up because the economy is down but Young is doubtful. "People have made that statement intuitively," he said. "I'd like to believe that statement, that if more people were working, it would go down. I don't know. I have no real data for it."

Young, who was in private practice before being elected twice as state's attorney, has experience in felony, medical malpractice, personal injury, business litigation and other civic areas. "When you go to court,

you want the person behind the bench to know what they're doing," he said. "I think it's important that the person you elect has the experience to handle important cases."

If elected, Young would not be able to hear any cases that he is currently involved with now, but, he said, that is no different than what happened to three other judges. John O'Rourke, Craig DeArmond and Michael Clary were all state's attorneys when they were named to the bench, Young said.

As state's attorney, Young said he has seen the impact that judges have on the system. Like other attorneys, he has been frustrated when he has asked for what he thought was a fair sentence but not gotten it from the judge.

Young said he could not discuss what he might do in a given situation but said his experience both as a prosecutor in the state's attorney's office and defense attorney while he was in private practice will be a help if he is elected.

"You have to remember you're a servant of the people," he said. "I think I have a good grasp of the many levels a judge will see. I think I can make a difference."
