According to unconfirmed reports, the Hoopeston Education Association ratified a new contract at a meeting Wednesday afternoon.

HEA and school board negotiators agreed on a new contract after meeting with a federal mediator for more than 12 hours Monday night.

The Hoopeston Area Board of Education must also approve the contract. The board is expected to vote on it at their regular meeting November 9.

identify the type of threat made but said the case affected several Hoopeston residents, causing "fear in the community" among families of the young men listed and rumors among other residents.

Police and school officials were in contact with parents of students whose names were listed in the written message.

Evidence was turned over to the Illinois State Police Forensic Laboratory. Those results, along with evidence, were then turned over to the state's attorney's office. Criminal charges could range from criminal damage to state-supported property and disorderly conduct.

The investigation revealed a suspect. Drollinger said he believes the person suspected of issuing the threat was looking for attention. "He got more attention than he bargained on," he added.
