Former Hoopeston resident to be new Fifth Circuit judge

A former Hoopeston resident will be the new judge in the Fifth Circuit. Democrat Nancy Samaras Fahey defeated incumbent State's Attorney Frank Young in Tuesday's midterm election. Fahey, who will fill the seat vacated when her husband, Tom, retired, received 7,746 votes to Young's 7,247. Fourteen

In another Vermilion County race, incumbent Don Crist was narrowly reelected to another term as treasurer.

Only 193 votes separated Crist, a Democrat, from challenger David Cunningham. Crist received 7,514 votes to Cunningham's 7.321.

Vermilion County voters bucked the state trend when it came to the governor's race. Rod Blagojevich was reelected to another term but locally, Republic challenger and state treasurer Judy Baar Topinka topped the incumbent, 7,298 to 5,953. Green Party candidate Rich Whitney received 1,760 votes and there were 158 write-in votes in the county.

County voters also defied the statewide trend in the race for Illinois Secretary of State. Democrat incumbent Jesse White held on to his seat but not locally. In Vermilion County, Republican challenger and state representative Dan Rutherford defeated White,



Party candidate Karen Young Peterson garnered 812 votes in the county and there were three write-in votes.

Illinois Rep. Tim Johnson will return to Washington, fending off Democratic challenger David Gill. In Vermilion County, the unofficial total was 8,544 votes for Johnson and 6,764 for Gill. with 10

write-in votes. Republican State Sen. Shane Cultra and Republican Superintendent of Schools Michael Metzen ran unopposed, as did incumbents Lynn Foster, Vermilion County Clerk; Pat Hartshorn, sheriff; and Sue Stine, treasurer.

District 1 candidates for Vermilion County Board also ran unopposed. Incumbent Gary Weinard received 1,649 votes and Pat Bailey got 1,555 votes.


