New wireless internet company set to debut on January 1

wireless Internet throughout the city starting January 1, 2007. Representatives of Illiana Web Company spoke at Tuesday's Hoopeston City Council meeting to

A new company plans to put

discuss their plans and ask for asneeded rights of way on city property to install equipment.

Principals in the company include Ed Hubbard, CEO/president; Mary Ann Kaufmann, CFO; Michael Ferrell, COO; Dale Hubbard, vice president, sales and acquisitions; Sherrene Hubbard, vice president, marketing/public relations; Chris Welch, vice president, engineering; and Steven Hupp, website development.

Ed Hubbard, who has served as CEO of WitchSchool, will leave WitchSchool at the end of the year to concentrate on the new company.

The company has divided the city into a grid of 13 areas, Ferrell said. Antennas will be placed in each of the areas to provide wireless Internet service.

The antennas will communicate with a T1 phone line to carry data. T1 lines and equipment are coming in and are expected to be up by Jan. 1, Ferrell said.

Internet speeds are estimated at 100 megabits per second for those close to the antennas and 11 megabits per second for those on the fringe areas. Each antenna is expected to cover 1,000 feet.

Along with Internet service, Illiana Web Company also plans to provide VOIP, voice over internet protocol, allowing users to make unlimited local and long distance calls for about \$350 per month. Dale Hubbard said.

Ferrell said the company will offer 256 encryption for privacy on designated emergency channels which could be used by city emergency personnel.

Internet service is one phase of what the company hopes to accomplish, according to a business plan distributed by the company at Tuesday's meeting. The other part of the business is expected to be data storage in an "information factory" to provide connection, computing power and data storage for individuals and com-

Once the system is up in Hoopeston, company officials plan to branch out to Danville and other communities along the east side of Interstate 57.

Alderman Bill Goodwine said that while good internet service is vital to the community, the city should interview several companies before backing a particular entity and would require more information, such as what types of contracts the company wants, franchise information and quality assurance issues.



Hubbard responded that the company is not looking for exclusivity from the city.


