Committee urged to work to entice different Internet services

Improved Internet service in Hoopeston will only be available if two existing companies step up to the plate.

"Hoopeston doesn't really need more wireless," James Eyrich told Hoopeston's economic development steering committee last week.

Eyrich talked to the committee on December 7 about what is needed in Hoopeston to improve Internet services for existing businesses and residents, as well as to attract new companies and citizens.

New residents and small- to medium-sized businesses might be attracted by the availability of Internet services through cable modems or DSL, (Digital Subscriber Line) which is offered by telephone companies, he said.

By doing so, Hoopeston would have higher-speed alternatives to what is currently available via wireless.

Companies such as call centers, that require high bandwidth and high reliability want redundant Internet connections that use different physical and logical paths to the Internet, such as the capability for data service over phone lines and fiber optic cable. By using more than one connection, these companies diminish the risk of being without Internet connectivity.

Eyrich urged the committee to work with Verizon, provider of local telephone service, and Charter Communications, cable provider, to bring Internet service to Hoopeston, one of the few communities in the area which does not have available cable or DSL Internet. "Even Rankin has cable Internet," he said.

While the city is short on cable or DSL service, what it has more than enough of is wireless providers, he said.

Existing wireless providers continue to upgrade

equipment to better serve their customers. One provider is reported to be boosting service to users in the southeast part of Hoopeston where their coverage has been spotty, Eyrich said.

Adding more wireless to the city would likely cause disruptions to users of existing services, because only three channels in the 802.11g (a protocol that only uses 2.4 GHz radio waves) can be used in the same area and must be shared among providers. Other wireless protocols that use other frequencies, such as 802.11a, are available, but they are less popular, equipment tends to be more expensive and they also have channel limitations, he said.

Local residents connect via dial-up, satellite and wireless. The drawback to those is lack of speed.

Dialup is the slowest type of connection and while wireless companies claim to be faster than either DSL or cable Internet, the 54Mbps speed promised is available only under ideal conditions, such as in a laboratory, Eyrich said.

In real applications, the speed is about half that close to the access point and slows for users further way from that point. Bandwidth is divided among all users in a town or individual cell, slowing the speed at which information may be up-or downloaded to kilobits per second rather than megabits. Also, that rate is the speed of connectivity between the customer and ISP (Internet Service Provider), not necessarily between the ISP and Internet, he said.

Ultimately, all customers of an ISP share the same uplink to the Internet, which must be large enough to accommodate all users' needs.

DSL and cable modems provide a direct link between the ISP and user, resulting in virtually no interference and higher speeds.
