City façade program running, changes made in regulations

The Façade Improvement Program is up and running. The Façade Improvement Committee met with architect Charles Reifsteck of Gorski Reifsteck Architects on December 12. The committee met again on January 4 to finalize the program. A preliminary sketch was completed by the architect and presented to the committee on January 9. All business owners within the project area have been notified of the program. If you are a business owner and have not received information please contact the Chamber office.

A few changes were made to the program description after it was originally distributed. The changes are as follows:

- 1. There is no application deadline. Applications will be received starting the week of January 8 on a first come first serve basis. Proposals will still need to meet program criteria and be approved by the façade committee. Funds are limited and when the designated \$10,000 for the year has been granted, no further funds will be available until the following year.
- 2. The building structure must be sound enough to support visual improvements (receipt of building inspection must accompany final paperwork submitted by owners that receive grant funding).
- 3. All sides of a building fully visual from the street are eligible for grant funding (this does not include the

backs of buildings but may include the sides of corner buildings).

4. No covered (plain plywood) windows will be accepted on an improved frontage.

The committee is compiling a list of area contractors who are available and interested in doing work on downtown buildings that receive funding. It will be up to the business owners who they choose to complete the improvements but all businesses receiving grant funds will receive the same contractor list. 
