ICC hearing on railroad crossings draws township interest

A scheduled meeting between the Illinois Commerce Commission and Milford officials scheduled for this month is drawing interest from other government agencies.

The hearing was scheduled so Milford officials could discuss the state of rail crossings in the village and while that issue has been resolved, representatives of other governing boards either plan to attend or are interested in what transpires.

That is true of Grant Township Road Commissioner Gary Weinard. At Tuesday's township board meeting, Weinard talked about the condition of some rail crossings in the county. Four crossings in the township are reportedly on a list to be repaired, he said, but when those repairs will be made is unknown. "We have people ask almost daily about those crossings," he told the board.

In other business, the board again discussed fire protection in rural Grant Township.
